## DUKE ELLINGTON AND HIS ORCHESTRA 1937

Beginning in 1936, key-members of the Duke Ellington Orchestra were also regularly involved in a series of small-group sessions. All these dates enable us to hear Duke's star soloists in a more intimate setting, often playing forgotten pop tunes of the day. Occasionally, musicians from other bands were also invited to pool their talents with those of the Ellinatonians!

pool their faients with those of the Lilingtonians! Edward Kennedy "Duke" Ellington was born in Washington, D.C., on April 29, 1899. While still at high school, he began playing in his native city. He soon organized his first little group, "The Duke's Serenaders", including Otto Hardwick and Arthur Whetsol, both of whom were to remain with him for many years. Duke Ellington first came to New-York in 1923 with "The Washingtonians", then still led by Elmer Snowden. A year later, the highly ambitious Duke Ellington took over the group and worked with it successfully at the "Kentucky Club" until 1927. The developing band's most successful engagement, at the "Cotton Club", lasted until 1931, when the fledgling Cab Calloway Orchestra took over their spot. Duble Ellington's first tour to England, Scotland and France in 1933 proved an immense personal and musical triumph, During the thirties, the Duke and his Orchestra travelled extensively in the United States, and their second visit to Europe six months before the outbreak of war enabled many of their admirers to hear the band in the flesh. Many agree that by 1940 the orchestra had reached its artistic peak. The band's first Carnegie Hall concert in january 1943 was followed by inumerable appearances at the world's most famous theatres. Duke Ellington was fortunately able to continue his regular tours around the globe until a short time before his death on May 24, 1974 - one month after celebrating his 75th birthday. This CD of the complete recordings of Duke Ellington opens with the first session under Cootie Williams" name. The

core of the Ellington band supports the superb Cootie on these happy romps. One day, after an important session by Chick Webb's own Big Band, his pianist Tommy Fulford sat in on a marvellous date by the "Gotham Stompers", recording arrangements by Wayman Carver. Chick's superb drumming is another welcome addition! Duke's full orchestra then follows with three commercially slanted vocals by Ivie Anderson. Despite the banality of these songs, her lovely contributions more than compensate such shortcomings. Barney Bigard's second date with his jazzopaters includes an outstanding up-tempo piece entitled "Four And One Half Street". In May 1937, Duke Ellington recorded the first big-band version of Juan Tizol's famous "Caravan", another item to remain in the band-book for decades to come! It had aliready been cut by Bigard's little outfit six months earlier - see Classics 666. The first of many sessions by Johnny Hodges with his band-mates is a mainly commercial affair, although by no means without interest. To be continued...
