THE COMPLETE DUKE ELLINGTON 1947-1952

CBS ou ses filiales ont enregistré Duke Ellington au cours de trois périodes : 1925-1940, 1947-1952 et 1956-1962.

"THE COMPLETE DUKE ELLINGTON 1947-1952" : cinq CD qui réunissent les derniers 78 tours et les premiers enregistrements réalisés sur bande magnétique par Duke Ellington durant ces cinq années. Il faut y adjoindre "ELLINGTON UPTOWN" (51-52), CD publié dans la collection CBS Jazz Masterpieces.

Nous avons préparé le programme des quatre premiers disques dans les studios CBS à New York en 1983 et en compagnie de l'ingénieur Frank Abbey. On y trouve quelques pièces dont la qualité musicale et historique fait oublier les imperfections techniques. Ces disques avaient fait l'objet d'un coffret LP publié par CBS France. S'y ajoutait "LIBERIAN SUITE" mais on n'y trouvait pas "MASTERPIECES BY ELLINGTON".

CBS or its subsidiary companies recorded Duke Ellington during three different periods: 1925-1940, 1947-1952 and 1956-1962.

"THE COMPLETE DUKE ELLINGTON 1947-1952" presents five CD's featuring the last 78 rpm records and the first magnetic tape recordings made by Duke Ellington within those five years. "ELLINGTON UPTOWN" (51-52), formerly released in the CBS Jazz Masterpieces collection is also coming out on CD.

The program of the first four records was prepared in the CBS New York studios with the help of sound engineer Frank Abbey in 1983. It features a few numbers whose musical and historical importance override the technical defects. These records were published at the time by CBS France in a box set featuring also the "LIBERIAN SUITE" but without "MASTERPIECES BY ELLINGTON".

LIBERIAN SUITE (Ellington) Tempo Music (CL 6073)

En 1947, à l'occasion du centenaire de la proclamation de la République, le gouvernement du Libéria - pays d'Afrique fondé au siècle dernier par des esclaves américains affranchis - commanda à Duke une œuvre commémorative : la Liberian Suite. L'édition originale, l'un des tous premiers microsillons 33 tours - 25 cm, fut réalisée en 1949, quelques années avant l'abandon du 78 tours.

"The Liberian Suite" was composed by Duke at the request of the Liberian government in order to commemorate the centenary of the Republic founded in Africa in 1847 by freed American slaves. One of the first 10 inches 33 - 1/3 rpm microgroove records ever published, the original issue of the Liberian Suite was released in 1949, a few years before the 78 rpm record became obsolete.
