From the ragtime era up to and including the post bebop era, Duke was able to stay modern and popular. As Benny Golson once said "Duke did everything and did it before everyone else".

Duke's harmonic conception made his orchestra sound bigger and fuller than the majority of the other bands existing. One of Duke's prides and a legitimate one, was his ability to write music that became almost instantly immortal; he could write standards! He could write popular music. At one time "Do nothing 'till you hear from me" was the no 1 song in America, no small achievement!

What you will find in this collection are almost all standards and are by far the best versions recorded by the Duke Ellington orchestra.
