

DUKE ELLINGTON est certainement le seul jazzman qui ait su cumuler parfaitement les fonctions de pianiste, compositeur, arrangeur et chef d'orchestre. Né à Washington en 1899 il commence à jouer du piano dans les night clubs de New-York pour payer ses études d'architecte qu'il abandonne en 1920 afin de se consacrer à la musique. En 1924 il prend la direction du groupe des "Washingtonians". Son orchestre trouve sa plénitude vers 1932 et se produit régulièrement au fameux COTTON CLUB jusqu'en 1936. Considéré dès lors par le public comme dirigeant le meilleur des orchestres de jazz, Duke fut régulièrement sollicité pour des concerts et des tournées dans le monde entier jusqu'à sa mort à New-York en mai 1974.

Le présent enregistrement a été réalisé le 5 novembre 1940 au Crystal Ballroom de Fargo (North Dakota), au cours d'une tournée. La prise de son, faite par un radio local sur des cires de 40 cm de diamètre, est tout à fait correcte. Les bruits de surface sont infimes et nous n'avons pas voulu les filtrer afin de ne pas dénaturer les sons.

On retrouve parmi le personnel de l'orchestre les plus grands musiciens des années 1940-1950 dont le départ fut malheureusement disparu aujourd'hui : Rex Stewart (tp), Lawrence Brown (tb), Barney Bigard (cl), Johnny Hodges (as), Ben Webster (ts), Harry Carney (bs) et Jimmy Blanton (b).

In the jazz field Duke Ellington is without doubt the one who could the most successfully hold several jobs together : he was at the same time a pianist, a composer, an arranger and a bandleader. Born in Washington D.C., 1899, he began to play piano in order to pay out his studies in architecture. But he gave up in 1920 to become a part of the jazz scene. In 1924 he took the head of the "Washingtonians" which turn fast very popular. The band got its maturity around 1932 and made regular appearances at the famous COTTON CLUB until 1936. From that time the Duke Ellington Orchestra, considered by the public as the best jazzband, gave innumerable concerts and toured the world on several occasions until Duke Ellington's death in New-York, may 1974.

This recording has been realized during a session at the Crystal Ballroom, Fargo (North Dakota) november 5, 1940. Made by a local radio station on antique lacquers, the take is quite correct in spite of some scratches that we didn't eliminate in order not to destroy the original sound.


