Carol Sloane is a jazz singer. Vocalists have scatted entire songs, entire sets, without a glimmer of the jazz feeling that Sloane achieves with three words of a ballad. She is the antithesis of the clueless vocalists whom jazz players deride as "chick singers." She is accepted by the most accomplished musicians as their fully qualified peer. This venture is unique in Sloane's long career and her discography of more than twenty albums. A program of jazz without bass and drums?
